Community Transition Care Program

About Community Transition Care

- Provides short term care for older people after a hospital stay in their own home to complete their recovery process and improve their functioning and level of independence.
- Program is goal oriented and therapy focused.
- Includes low intensity therapy such as physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech pathology as well as social work, nursing care and dietetics.

What services are provided?

Eligible clients will be provided services based upon their immediate care needs and future planning which could include;

- Case Management a designated health professional to coordinate care, establish support and services.
- Nursing care including showering assistance, wound and medication management.
- Domestic assistance including light housekeeping, laundry, shopping and transport to medical appointments.
- Additional therapeutic care including physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, dietetics and social work.
- Medical management in collaboration with your general practitioner.
- Nursing services available 7 days per week including public holidays.
- Allied Health services available Monday to Friday excluding public holidays.

How much does it cost?

- 17.5% aged care pension (cost accumulated daily).
- Financial consideration will be provided in special circumstances prior to hospital discharge.

How do I access this program?

- A referral to the Aged Care Assessment Team for an eligibility assessment will be made by your hospital treating team.
- All clients must sign a client recipient agreement prior to commencement of program.
- Clients must commence program directly upon discharge from hospital or a subacute facility.
