

Assistive Equipment

Assistive equipment can improve safety and independence following injury or illness.

Assistive equipment is prescribed by an Occupational Therapist after formal assessment. Assessment factors considered will include:

- patient factors (recovery status, level of assistance required, what you can or can't do)
- the environment where the equipment will be used

Some common assistive equipment prescribed prior to discharge home are pictured below. Please discuss your individual needs with your Occupational Therapist to guide the right assistive equipment prescription for you.
