Rotational Juniors – remote call is approximately 1 evening every 4-6 weeks and is used for (theatre assist only) except in extenuating circumstances. Emergency Department Juniors – remote call is approximately 1 evening 4-5 weeks and is used to cover emergent leave only.

WARD CALL

Does your facility require ward call? If yes, what are the conditions?

Night Ward Call is covered by junior doctors allocated to ED and working in a dedicated ward call capacity. Weekday evening ward call Mon-Fri is covered by PGY 2s & 3s. Weekend Ward Call is shared by all RMOs as per Unit roster with the exception of those working on the ED roster.

EDUCATIONAL SESSIONS

Does your facility provide educational sessions? If yes, what type of educational sessions and how often would they occur?

1 Full time and 1 part time MEO and 1 part time DCT on site.

Custom-built dedicated Education Centre and Library with Satellite, Video and Teleconference facilities.

Intern specific education, Junior Doctor professional development program and Grand Rounds weekly plus unit specific education undertaken on a regular basis.

WORKLOAD and OVERTIME

Core Terms:

- Medicine: 38 hours + average 5 hours un-rostered overtime per week
- Surgery/Urology: 38 hours + 5 hours un-rostered overtime per week
- Orthopaedics: 38 hours + average 5 hours un-rostered overtime per week
- Emergency: 38 hours + nil un-rostered overtime per week

Elective Terms:

• Obstetrics & Gynaecology: 38 hours + average 3 hours un-rostered overtime per week, Anaesthetics/ICU, Paediatrics, Oncology, Rehabilitation Medicine, Radiology & Palliative Care: 38 hours + average 1 - 2 hours un-rostered overtime per week

NIGHT DUTY

Does your facility require night duty? If yes, what are the conditions?

In Emergency Medicine interns are rostered to night duty with one PGY 2 and one PGY 3 doctor as well as two registrars i.e. minimum of 5 ED staff rostered on overnight with consultant on call. The Emergency Medicine department also rosters a dedicated night ward call junior doctor. In General Medicine, one junior doctor is rostered to night duty and works closely with the overnight medical registrar, primarily assisting with admissions.

LEAVE

Am I able to take leave any time during the year or will I have to be part of a leave roster?

5 weeks scheduled leave is available.

RELOCATION

Does your facility provide financial assistance with relocation?

No. this is not offered to Interns.

ACCOMMODATION

Does your facility provide accommodation or financial assistance with accommodation?
